

Job Title: Teacher of Law**Department information:**

Law is a popular subject at the college, with a current cohort of approximately 600 students supported by a team of 8 teachers. The department delivers the OCR A-level specification (currently 10 Year 1 classes and 9 Year 2 classes) alongside the BTEC National Extended Certificate in Applied Law for students seeking a vocational pathway.

Classrooms are equipped with interactive whiteboards and integrated with the college intranet and media server. We place a strong emphasis on Information Learning Technology (ILT) and make extensive use of Google Classroom to support teaching and learning.

We provide a full program of student support and enrichment, including:

- Subject workshops, a Law Society and Mock Trial activity.
- Visiting guest speakers and educational trips.
- A commitment to promoting diversity within the legal profession.

The appointed teacher will report to one of the Heads of Law, who work under the Director of Curriculum and Support for Faculty 4.

The Law Department operates through a consultative and collaborative approach. All teachers contribute to the development of course materials and are encouraged to engage in continuous staff development. We are a team dedicated to helping every student reach their potential through a supportive and inclusive environment.
